

THE MAN AND THE BAND WHO MAKE THE JAZZ AGE COME ALIVE



In reviewing "There's a Future in the Past," the *Los Angeles Times* reported that "[u]nless you're a jazz aficionado or a denizen of New York's classier nightclubs and society functions, you may not be familiar with the work of Vince Giordano - even though the bandleader and music archivist has been one of the most in-demand early 20th century Americana revivalists for decades." The review continues that "Dave Davidson and Amber Edwards' documentary "Vince Giordano: There's a Future in the Past" is a fine introduction to a musician so respected that filmmakers like Woody Allen and Martin Scorsese have called on him to help re-create the sounds

of the '20s and '30s in their period pictures. Always, Giordano strives to transport audiences of today into another world."

The *Los Angeles Times* was not alone in praising Giordano and the documentary. For example,

- Leonard Maltin notes that "for nearly forty years Vince has kept the music of the 1920s and 30s alive, leading an elite 11-piece band that plays original arrangements from the period with flair and precision." He notes that " the film makes me admire Vince's singular vision all the more.
- The *Chicago Tribune* reported "Night after night the band rips through tunes by George Gershwin, Duke Ellington, Cole Porter and others, dazzling audiences with tightly synchronized performances. Led by Giordano on bass sax, double bass and tuba, the tuxedo-clad Nighthawks blow the roof off with arrangements culled from his massive home library of more than 60,000 scores.
- Boardwalk Empire creator Terence Winter notes that Vince is "not just an expert. He's an amazing performer who keeps this music alive, and he deserves recognition for his work." Winter should know. Boardwalk Empire's first soundtrack album won a Grammy.
- The Wall Street Journal reports that "The Spirit of Vintage Jazz is Living in Brooklyn."
- *Jazz Age* reports that "Giordano's passion and commitment to the music are evident; over the years he sought out and studied with important creators from the era, including Paul Whiteman's arranger Bill Challis. His band, the Nighthawks, reflects this same dedication and musicianship, and the film captures the energy of the live performances that have drawn in a new audience of 20-somethings interested in "trad jazz."

So, what's different about the Washington-area premiere of this highly acclaimed documentary? Vince and the Nighthawks!
